In September 2001, a new and exciting opportunity for young musicians from the central Virginia region began. Sixty-seven students from eighteen different high schools and home-schooled students auditioned for placement in the newly formed Lynchburg Symphony Youth Orchestra and Junior Strings Ensemble. That number has grown to over ninety students. This devoted group of young musicians typically rehearses once a week from late September through March, performs two major concerts, and participates in various capacities during the school year. We are an allied organization of the Lynchburg Symphony Orchestra.

Meet the Directors

Mr. Bruce Habitzruther has a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the State University of New York at Fredonia. While there he was selected concerto competition winner in his junior year. He did further studies at the Royal Conservatory and Royal Academy of the Fine Arts in Antwerp, Belgium. At the Conservatory he majored in cello performance and conducting. Mr. Habitzruther received a Master of Music Degree in performance (cello) from Wichita State University where he received a full Ford Foundation Grant. While in Wichita he played with the Wichita Symphony Orchestra and was a member of the Graduate String Quartet.

Mr. Habitzruther is retired from the Lynchburg City Schools where he was string specialist and Director of Strings. He recently retired from Lynchburg College, after teaching there for 43 years, and has previously taught at Randolph-Macon Woman's College, Sweet Briar College and the Virginia School of the Arts. Mr. Habitzruther received the 2005 Mayor's Award of Excellence and is the first musician in the city to be awarded this honor. He is founder and retired music director/conductor of the Lynchburg Symphony Orchestra.

Mrs. Ellen Habitzruther received her Bachelor of Music Degree in Performance from the Eastman School of Music in Rochester, New York. She studied for several summers at Tanglewood, home of the Boston Symphony Orchestra. She was awarded a Ford Foundation grant to study at Wichita State University where she received her Master of Music Degree. While in Wichita she performed with the Wichita Symphony Orchestra and the Wichita State Graduate String Quartet. Mrs. Habitzruther was selected as concerto competition winner and soloed with the Wichita State University Orchestra. Mrs. Habitzruther is retired from the Lynchburg City Schools as a string specialist. She has taught at Randolph-Macon Woman's College and the Virginia School of the Arts. In 1994, Mrs. Habitzruther was honored by the YWCA Academy of Women for Achievement in the Arts. She recently retired from Lynchburg College, after teaching there for 43 years and is retired concertmaster of the Lynchburg Symphony Orchestra.

String Auditions for seating placement- LSYO only

Scheduled for Tuesday, October 11, 2016. A panel of judges will hear selected passages of your music. All students will be auditioned.

Communications

Most communication to musicians will be in the form of notices handed out at rehearsals. Students must take responsibility to listen carefully in rehearsal and diligently pick up and read any materials distributed. E-mail will also be used as a means of communication with students and parents. **Please like and follow the LSYO Facebook page as well!**

Scholarships

Senior Scholarships

Each year the LSYO makes scholarship awards to one or more seniors. These awards are presented at the spring concert. Scholarship applications are open to any senior member of the LSYO who will be pursuing a major in a field of music. Music minors may apply and will be considered if funds are available. Eligibility will be based on the student's plans for pursuing a career in music, leadership role in LSYO and demonstrated musical proficiency. (*Seniors: See enclosed application form.*)

Need-based Scholarships for LSYO/JS members

Partial financial scholarships are available to students who cannot meet LSYO tuition costs. Please see the manager for a financial statement form. Guidelines for awarding financial scholarships are similar to the free lunch guidelines of the Lynchburg City Schools.

Membership Requirements and Agreement Form

The success of our Lynchburg Symphony Youth Orchestra and Junior Strings depends on its musicians. Commitment is a must. Please read these requirements carefully.

Each student musician and a parent must read and sign this agreement either with electronic registration or by turning a hard copy. Return it, along with tuition check or installment payment, to the manager by August 24, 2016.

I. Rehearsals and Attendance

Rehearsals take place most Tuesdays at Court Street United Methodist Church in downtown Lynchburg. Your attendance at all rehearsals, dress rehearsals and concerts is required. All performers are important to the ensemble and excessive absences and tardiness are detrimental to the progress of the groups. *Excessive absences may result in dismissal.* Illness, school conflicts or family emergencies are to be reported to the manager at 845-6675 before the scheduled rehearsal and are excused. Please leave a message on the machine. Attendance will be taken at all rehearsals. If absent for any reason, the musician should inquire about the announcements made and music covered at the missed rehearsal from their section leader or stand partner.

II. Promptness and Preparedness

Be ready to play 10 minutes before rehearsals-warmed-up and tuned. Rehearsal equipment needed: instrument, music, mutes, reeds, rock stops, extra strings, and pencils with erasers (never use pen or highlighter on LSYO/JS music).

III. Music and Instruments

You are responsible for your own music. Do not rely on your stand partner to bring the music. Some rental music may cost up to \$500.00 per page to replace. There will be a replacement charge for all music lost. Please keep it in good condition; it is all borrowed music and must be returned in the same condition that you received it. Never write in pen or marker in the music! Music will be collected immediately following the concert for each semester.

Parents need to be sure that instruments are insured. The LSYO is not responsible for damages incurred before, during or after rehearsals or at concerts.

Percussionists need to carefully return instruments to the locked storage area. Percussionists should bring their own sticks, mallets, etc. and should arrive early to set up properly and return instruments to the storage area after rehearsal.

IV. Conduct

Act professionally at all times and be careful around the many expensive instruments in the rehearsal room, the LSO stands and chairs and percussion equipment. We are guests of Court Street United Methodist Church. Act responsibly! There is no gum chewing allowed on the premises, and please keep the floor clean at refreshment time. All persons should stay away from the grand piano. There is absolutely no writing on the music stands. **Students are not permitted in other areas of the church except for auditions and sectionals.** Please enter and exit the church from the rehearsal room door.

V. Concert Dress

LADIES: Long or short-sleeved white blouse, full-length black skirt or black wide-legged black pants, dark hosiery, and black shoes. No tight fitting or low cut blouses. No high slit skirts or tight pants are allowed)

MEN: Black pants, white shirt, black shoes and socks, and long dark ties.

VI. Tuition

To cover our expenses participation in the LSYO/ JS will be \$250.00 per year. There will be no refunds. Partial financial (need based) scholarships are available. Please see the manager for a financial statement form.

Please check one option:

- I am paying the annual tuition in full and submitting payment by August 24, 2016 along with the membership agreement and volunteer forms.
- I will pay in 3 installments. The first payment is due August 24, 2016 (\$85.00) along with the membership agreement and volunteer forms. Two additional payments will be remitted at or before the rehearsals on October 4-(\$85) and November 1-(\$80). Students will be dropped from the organization if all fees are not received by November 1.

VII. Snack and Rehearsal Cleanup

Each week the LSYO, with the help of dedicated volunteers, will be providing snacks to the students. This is a wonderful opportunity for the students to socialize and to energize after their full days of academics, sports and other activities. All families may be asked to assist with snack service and kitchen cleanup once each semester. In addition, orchestra students will take turns putting away stands and rearranging tables. Please see the enclosed snack form for non-member siblings wishing to partake of the snacks.

VIII. Photography/Audio

By signing this agreement, the parent/guardian of _____ (student), gives consent for the LSYO/JS to make audio and video recordings and take photographs of the student during any LSYO/JS activity. Dear **LSYO** Parents,

Each Tuesday rehearsal, your student will be provided a snack. The menu will depend on what I can find in season/ on sale. I will try my best to offer a variety of foods, as healthy as possible/ practical, that everyone can enjoy. Typically, we have fruit/ veggies, cheese 'n crackers, chips 'n dips, cookies/ baked goods, & juice. Occasionally, we have a meat entree, like chicken salad/ BBQ sliders, summer sausage, meatballs, pepperoni, or lunch meat.

In order to do all this, I need HELP. Assistance in the following areas will be greatly appreciated: preparing/ plating food, serving/ refilling trays, & cleanup (washing/ drying dishes, wiping tables/ counters, sweeping the floor, putting out the trash). Dependability & teamwork are essential. I need someone who is willing to make the kids a priority & be there for them every rehearsal, rain or shine. If you enjoy baking or cooking treats from home occasionally, that would be a godsend, though not a requirement. Hours are approximately concurrent with the rehearsals: 5:15 - 7:15 PM. Please speak with Betty Wong or Mrs. Habitzruther at rehearsal if you can help.

Contributions/ donations will also be most welcomed & appreciated. Nonperishable items, like tortilla chips, crackers, packaged cookies/ snacks, are preferable. Please mark your name on your donation(s).

In fairness to all, the same \$1.00 fee per person per rehearsal (\$17.00 per year) needs to be paid to the LSYO.

Out of each student's tuition payment \$1.00 per rehearsal (\$17.00 per year) is earmarked for snacks. The snack coordinators purchase snacks for their group based on the number enrolled. They follow the food budget per the policy set by the Parent Organization.



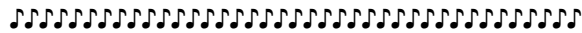

Concerto Competition**

Our Spring Concert on March 18, 2017 will feature the winner of the LSYO Concerto Competition.

Candidates need to prepare a movement from any major concerto or solo piece with orchestral accompaniment from the standard repertoire. **The selection must be playable by the LSYO and no longer than 12 minutes in length.** Students should make a recording of their performance with piano accompaniment and submit it to Mrs. Habitzruther by **Tuesday, December 6, 2016**. A panel of judges will listen to these recordings and a live/final audition of selected candidates will be scheduled for January. Performers need to have their selection memorized and must perform with an accompanist at this final audition. **Three copies of the piano accompaniment must be submitted for the live audition.**

If you are interested in the Concerto Competition, please complete the following form and submit it to Mrs. Habitzruther by October 4, 2016.

Any student who is even remotely considering auditioning should speak with Mr. Habitzruther about possible concerto selections at the September 27th or October 4th rehearsal. Students who have won the concerto competition will be eligible to audition again after three years.
